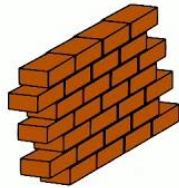

# Day 3

## You will need:

- My House template
- White card
- Felt tip pens or pencil crayons
- Black pen
- Scissors
- Glue stick



1) Choose a My House template and print it onto white card.



2) Next, colour in your template using pencils or crayons. You could add bold textures to your design using felt tips pens. We have used a brown felt tip pen to create the roof tiles and a red felt tip pen to make a brick pattern.



3) Create a design for each of the windows and doors, depending on which template you have chosen. You could simply shade each window in blue to look like the glass or you could add curtains or blinds.



4) Inside each window, draw a picture that represents your household. You could draw the people you live with, your pets or what you might see in each room or on each floor. You can use the black pen to add a bold outline to your drawings before colouring them in.



5) Using the scissors, neatly cut out each template, including the windows and doors, depending on which template you have chosen.



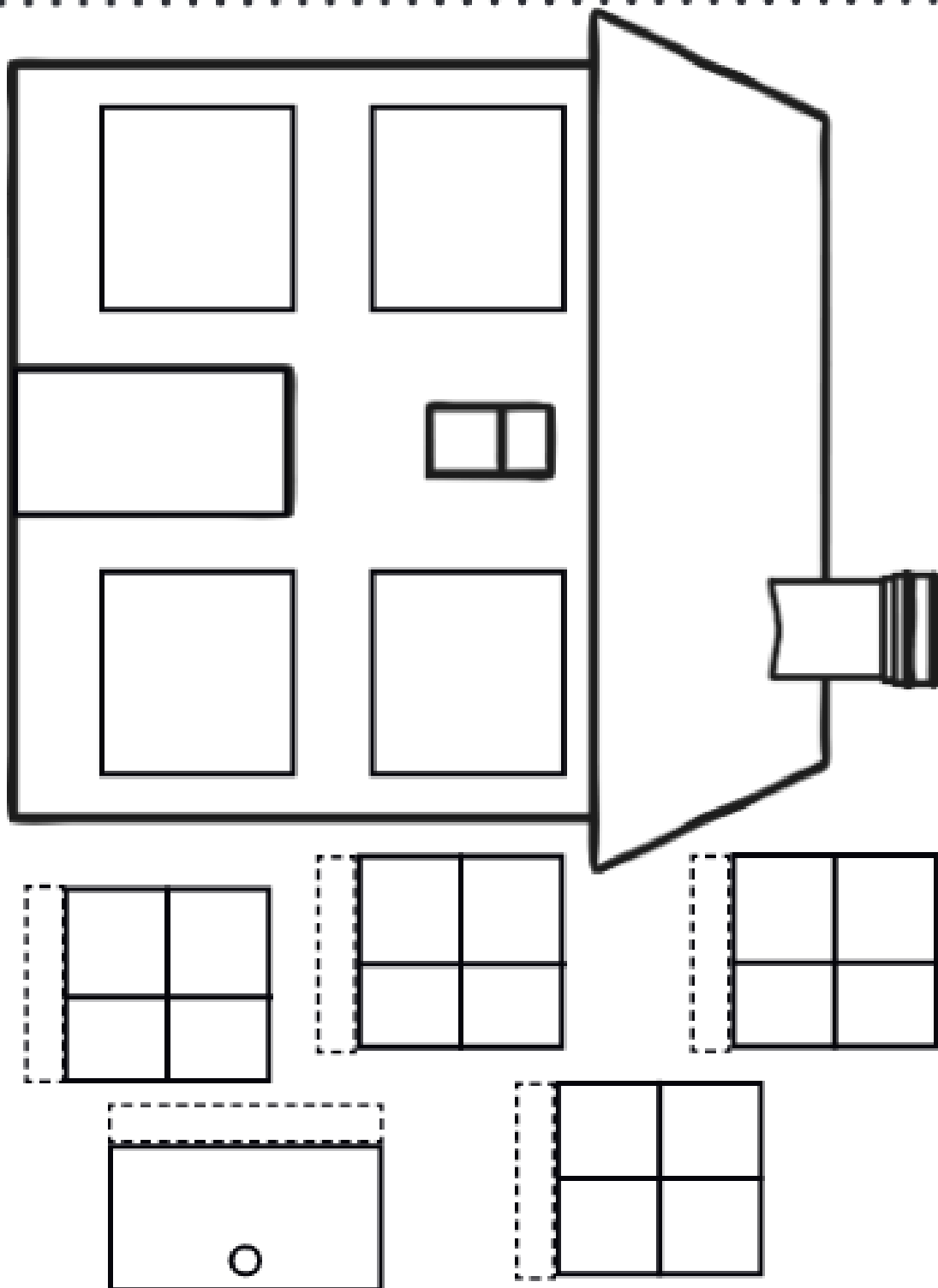
6) Spread glue onto the thin tab at the side of each window and door cut-out, depending on the template you have chosen. Place the tabs onto the template so that the cut-outs line up with those on your template. Allow the glue to dry.



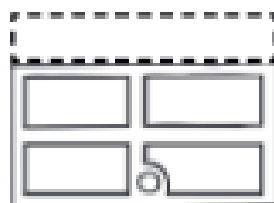
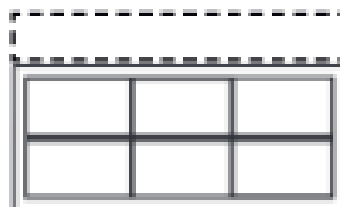
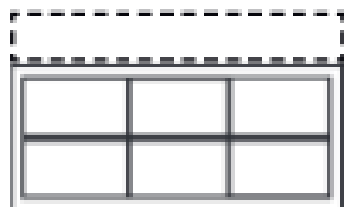
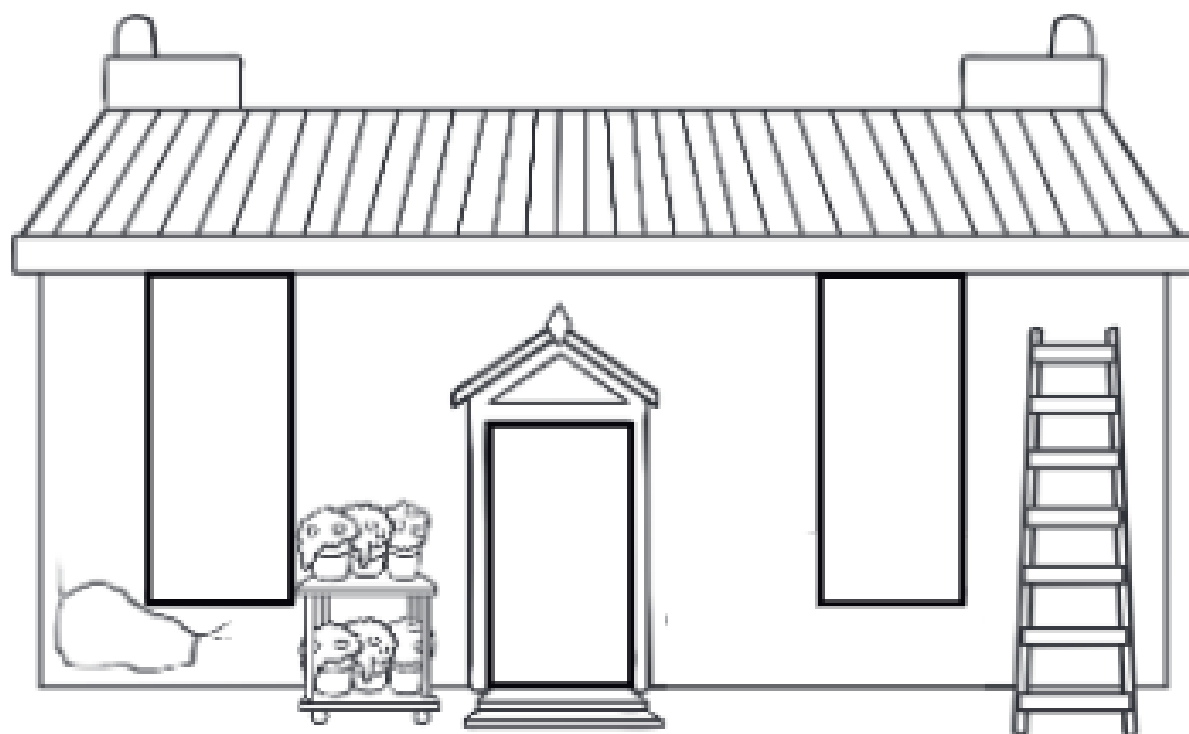
7) Fold back each cut-out back to reveal who is in each window and door, depending on your template.
