constitutional values

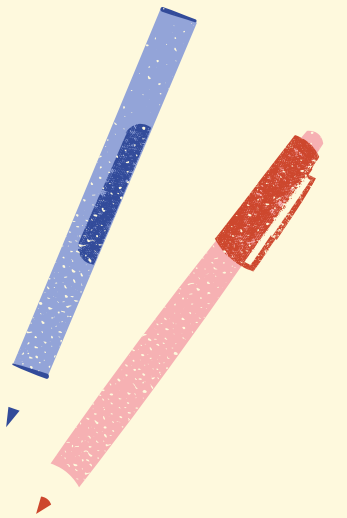




Characteristics of a role model



- Positive role models do good things and if you copy, then you will be a better person.
- Negative role models do bad things and if you copy them, you become a bad person.
- Parents are influential role models in your life. You learn about your morals and values from them



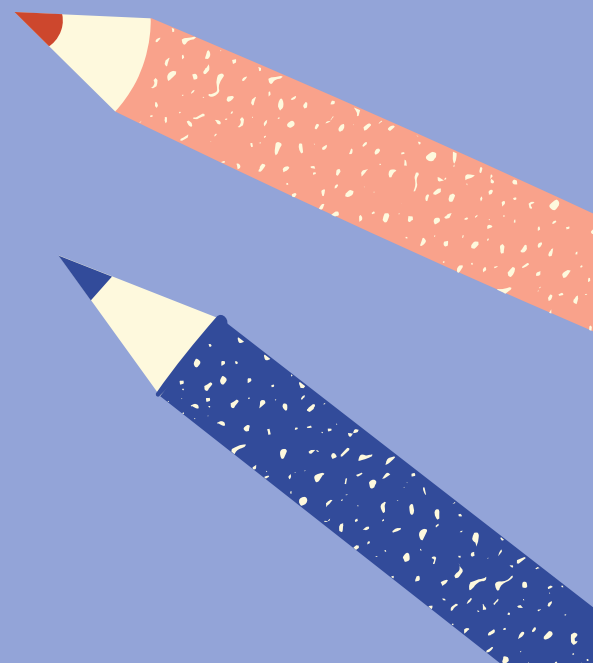
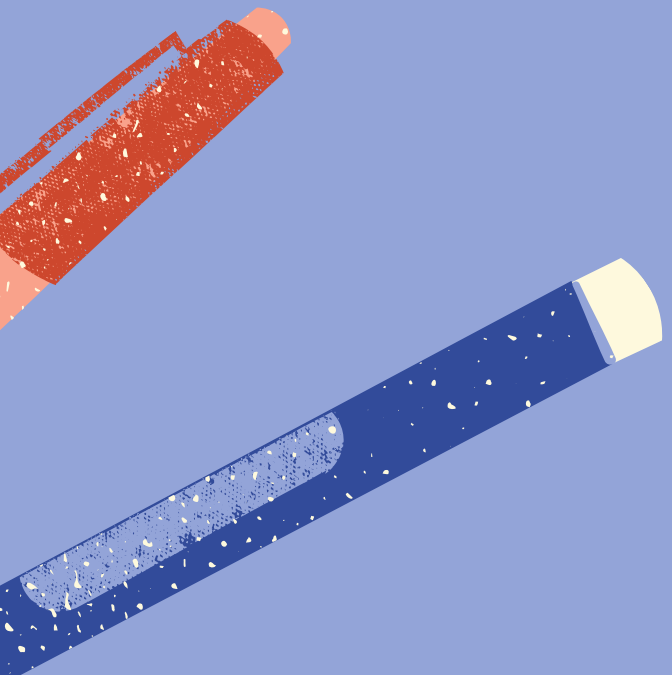
Leaders in your community



- Teachers – leaders at school: Educate you and set an example of how to behave.
- Religious leaders- Sport coaches, political leaders, business people assist in promoting human rights in a community.



Applying constitutional values in daily life





Human dignity

- Treat other people with respect i.e. use appropriate language and do not harm anyone physically.
- Eradicate bullying at school and everywhere else. Be sensitive to every human being.
- Encourage other people to take part in nation building activities.



Equality

- Do not discriminate against people. Improvement of education and employment levels in your community is vital e.g. being responsible about your school work in order to help others in your community.
- Volunteer yourself in programmes that suite your personality. E.g. helping at an old age home.



Freedom

Be involved in democratic processes e.g. be part and parcel of SRC at your school. At the age of 18 you will be qualified to vote.



The constitutional values.

Explanation on each value

- In democracy all people have rights.**
- Everyone must be given fair and equal treatment.**
- Everyone is equal before the law. Nobody must be discriminated based on race, gender, sex, pregnancy, religion, marital status, ethnic or social origin, colour, sexual orientation, age, disability, religion, belief, culture, language and birth**
- Discrimination on grounds of race and gender**

Other values to uphold

Show commitment to your family by respecting and honouring your parents. Be kind and loyal to the rest of the family.

- Preservation and conservation of natural environment e.g. protecting plant and animal life.



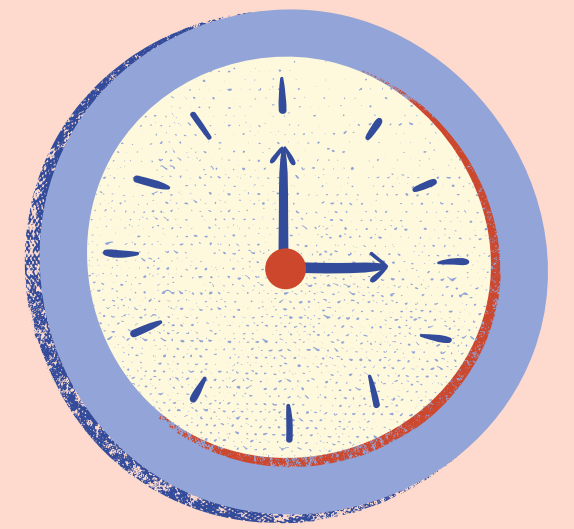
- Preventing pollution includes not littering at school and at home.

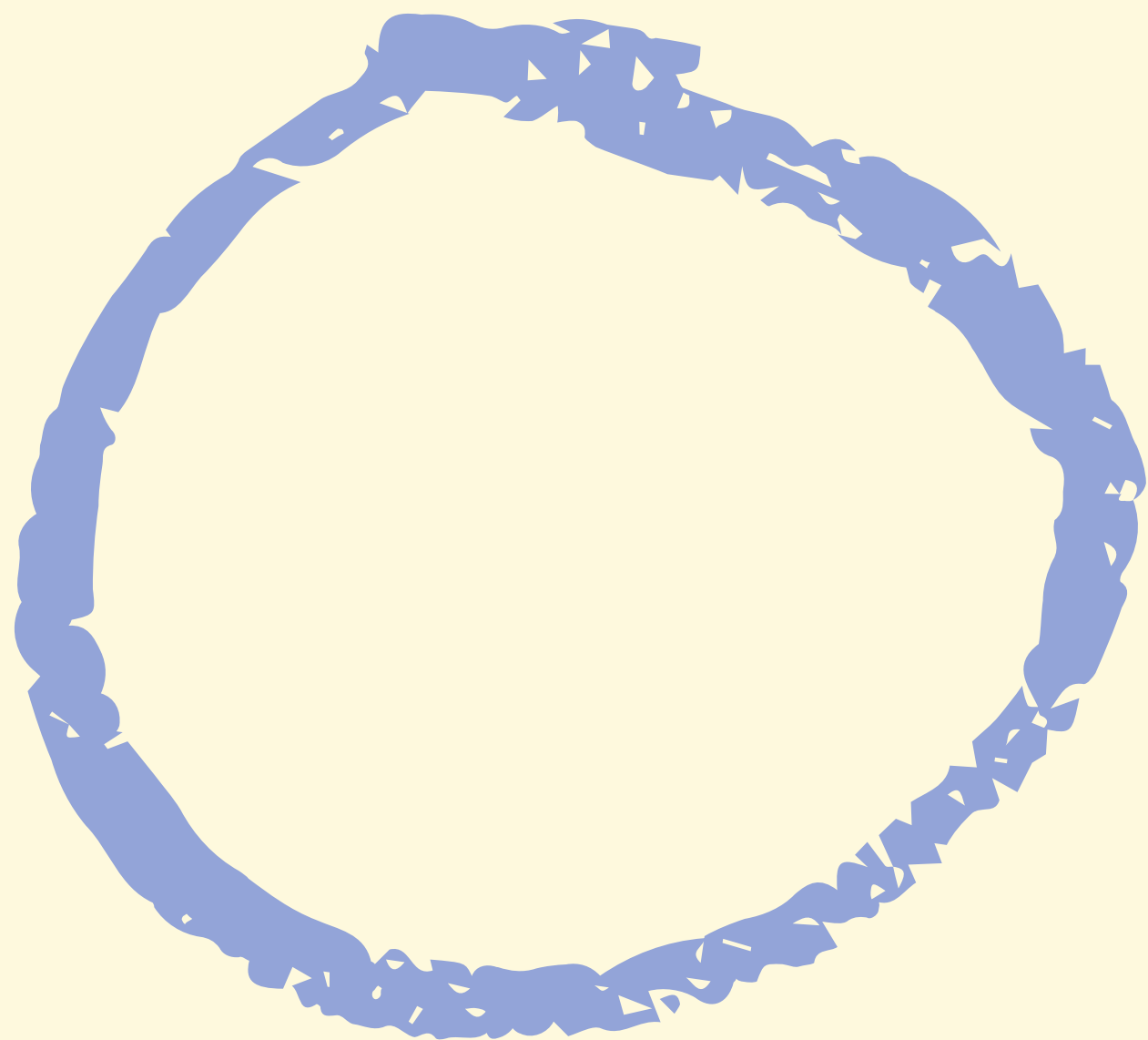


- Avoid wasting water.

Right to citizenship means:

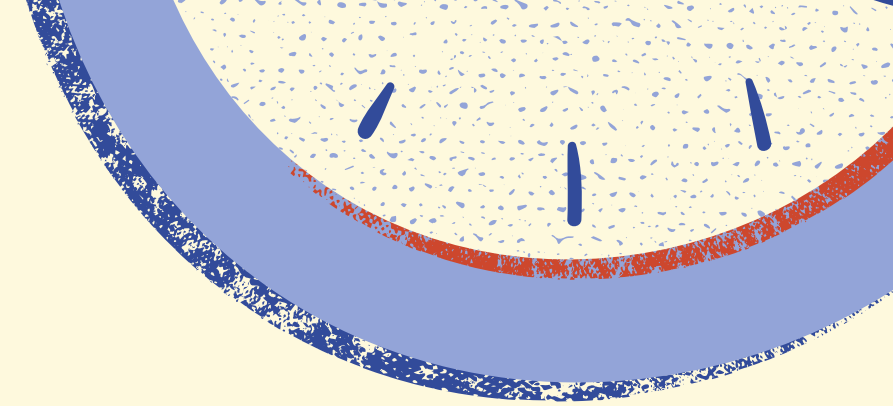

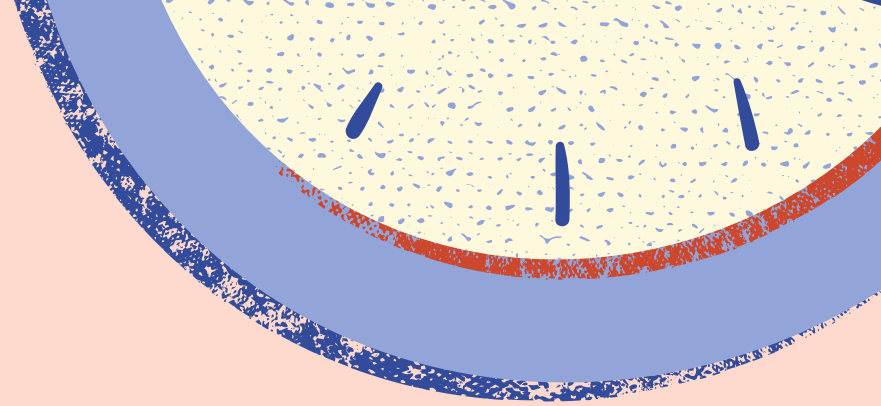
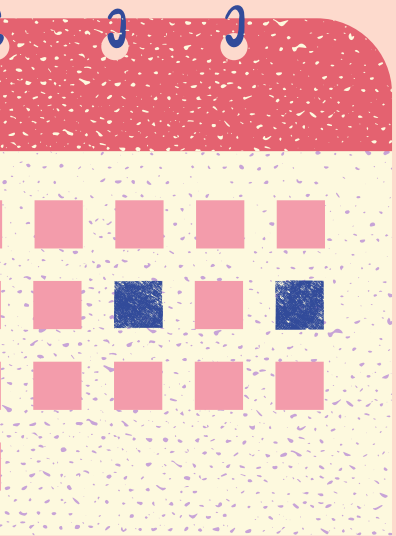
